

Peer I (Men Only) is a 126-bed Therapeutic Community that offers long-term, intensive treatment for men who are addicted to drugs and alcohol. Licensed by the Colorado Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division (ADAD), Peer I (Men Only) is contracted by the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice as a Community Corrections center. Clients are referred from the criminal justice system, a direct judicial sentence, or from a variety of noncriminal justice agencies.

Peer I (Men Only) clients typically stay nine to 12 months in residential treatment, followed by an additional 12 months of outpatient TC treatment services. Long-term outcomes are very positive. In fact, according to the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice, recidivism rates for clients who have successfully completed treatment at Peer I (Men Only) are among the lowest in the state.

Peer I (Men Only) also offers a short-track program that involves a six month stay in residential treatment and four months of outpatient treatment. This program is designed for clients who are not serving a community corrections sentence but could benefit from the structure and support that Peer I (Men Only) provides.
